Mr. Sanjiv Saraf, founder of Rekhta.org and the main force behind the festival says, "Jashn-e-Rekhta is a platform to showcase the world of Urdu through the eyes and experience of the masters. We aim to reach out to both the Urdu speaking and the non-Urdu speaking audience."
